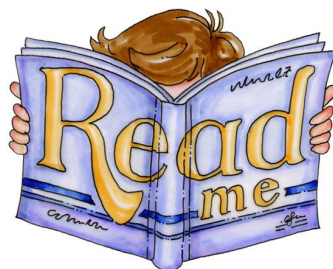
BOOK BINGO

Let's soar into reading with Book Bingo! Just a reminder ... the goal of this "at-home" project is to motivate students to read a variety of books. Students may choose books from home, the library, or from a friend. The Petersham Library has been given a copy of our Book Bingo and has stocked their shelves with books that meet each box (as long as they handle with care). Your child will find some books more challenging than others. **Do not worry if your child needs help reading a book. It is perfectly fine for you to provide reading assistance.** Finally, in order to verify that each child is reading the books he/she writes down, please initial each one after the title. Thank you for your time and commitment to this project! Let the reading begin!

Directions for Book Bingo

This game is played like Bingo with the following exception: **to cross off a square in Book Bingo, a player must meet the reading challenge written in the square.** Once the player has 5 boxes crossed off, (going down, across or diagonally) he/she must bring the Book Bingo card to school over the first few days. Students are challenged to continue reading for **Book Bingo Blackout** (crossing off every square)! Book Bingo Blackout is not a have to summer assignment. But, anyone completing it will receive a reading prize the first week of school in class and will also earn a principal's award.
